August 2020



The Diocese of Coventry will stream an online service on each of the five Sunday mornings in August.

All the services will start at 10:00 am, and the themes are:

2 August - Sabbath Rest

9 August - Embracing Change

16 August - Building Hope

23 August - Maintaining Spiritual Fervour

30 August - Take Heart

These worship services will be streamed on our Facebook page and YouTube channel. The non-eucharistic services will reflect the various traditions and contexts across the diocese. Further details will be published on the Church Online section of the website.

Churches that want to engage with one or more of these services can do so in three different ways

- By simply pointing people to the diocesan service
- By point people to the diocesan service and then hosting your own Zoom coffee afterwards
- By incorporate the diocesan sermon into your own service

If you want to act missionally, consider getting permission from local community Facebook groups to stream our services. That is how one church with a usual Sunday attendance of 50 adults has managed to attract 1000 devices viewing their worship every week!

New Deacons and Priests

Normally in late June/ early July the new deacons and priests are ordained at Coventry Cathedral. However, due to the Covid 19 pandemic, this has been postponed until late September. As the ordinands prepare for ordination we pray for them. You will find a brief biography of each of the new deacons and the names of the priests in this edition of the Prayer Diary. In the Cycle of Prayer for this month, the words of the Litany from the Ordination service are included as well as a variety of other people and events for you to remember in your prayers.



Sarah Ashelby will be a deacon at St Stephen's, Canley and St John's Westwood. Sarah is married to Mike and they have two children, Layla (9) and Reuben (7). She trained at St Mellitus in London. During her studies she had a particular interest in mission in a digital culture, so she is looking forward to applying her learning at the moment! Most of her time will be spent in Canley with a particular focus on how to develop missional leaders. She would appreciate prayers for creativity around this.

Daniel Bennett will be a deacon at St Michael's, Stoke. Before training for ministry he lived in London and was primarily an academic, working in the area of social media, journalism and conflict.
