On Saturday 16 November, members of Diocesan Synod met for the first meeting of the new triennium (a fancy word for a three-year term).

The meeting also marked Bishop's Ruth last Diocesan Synod with us as Acting Bishop of Coventry, after a year in the role.

#### **16 NOVEMBER 2024**

#### **2025 BUDGET**

Synod reviewed the proposed 2025 budget for the Coventry Diocesan Board of Finance (CDBF). The budget is reviewed by the **Diocesan Finance Group and Investment Sub-Committee before** being scrutinised by Bishop's Council who are the Directors and Trustees of the DBF.

Following the recommendation by Bishop's Council, Diocesan Synod approved the 2025 CDBF budget, authorising a maximum expenditure for the upcoming year of £14.232 million.

## **APPOINTMENT OF DIOCESAN BISHOPS -A MEMBERS' MOTION**

Synod debated and voted on a motion brought by a member concerning the process by which Bishops are appointed.

Synod agreed a motion which will now be passed to General Synod, requesting changes to the timeline in those cases where an appointment is not initially made.
