Thank you for continuing new families coming in and for the way in which friendships and support networks are growing. Please pray for strength, resilience and good health (physical and mental) for our families and the staff team as we seek to support vulnerable families from across the city in a wide variety of ways.
- **5 St Laurence's Foleshill** This autumn we have been encouraged to pray audacious prayers! We are thankful for answered prayers in the form of our new Growing Faith Worker, Dagmer, who will be working with children and youth across the church and local schools. We would so appreciate prayer for all aspects of our work with children, across church and schools. For all in our church family we are praying that we will grow in our love for one another and our hunger for God.
- **9 Bablake School chaplaincy (Coventry School Foundation CSF) -** Thanks for a smooth start to the academic year. We pray for our links with ICONS in Germany, for Harvest Festivals in each CSF school and for preparations for Remembrance services. We pray for Community Cohesion in our wider Community and the wellbeing of our families, pupils and staff.
- 11 St Luke's, Holbrooks We give thanks for the continued growth in the family of faith in Holbrooks, especially among young adults. Prayers would be appreciated for Fr Simon as he leads the Deanery in the period of interregnum; for Deacon Charles Cowper in his continuing formation; and for Deacon Sarah Gillard-Faulkner (Associate Minister and Chaplain at HMP Onley) as next month's Prisons Week approaches.
- 12 All Saints, Allesley We are grateful for our new curate Ann joining us in July and for all she brings to us as clergy continue to work alongside a fantastic team of lay people. We are grateful for the ways God is developing connection with people through our churchyard, via Muddy Church trails, Outdoor Church in the summer and a Gospel Giveaway box. Please pray for Youth Alpha in the Autumn term; we are hosting and partnering with other nearby churches, and it will be led by young people themselves. Please pray for our missional opportunities with families generally and for the growing relationship with Allesley Primary School, through Harvest, Narnia weekend at the start of Advent, and Christmas.
- 13 St Thomas, Keresley with Coundon We give thanks for another year of engagement with our local community, schools and seeing our congregation grow in number. It is a joy to minister alongside a great team of lay people as we worship and serve together. We've adjusted how we do our children's work over the summer and so are excited and would ask you to pray as we align our Sunday school and main service sermons to be following the same material which we hope will foster greater parent/child and congregation/children relationships. We also ask for prayer over our community space in Keresley Village where we continue to be a regular presence, offering a weekly coffee morning as well as a sewing group, messy breakfast and supporting wider community initiatives in conjunction with the resident's association and community library.
- 14 St John the Baptist (city centre) We give thanks for the success of our 'Safe and Dry' fundraising campaign, and the work to the building that is now happening as a result of that. We pray for the development of a clearer sense of our mission to the city centre.

- 23 St Francis of Assisi, Radford We give thanks for the blessing of our growing church family. As October unfolds, we look forward to a joyful season of worship and celebration, with special services marking Harvest, Black History Month, and our cherished St Francis Pet Service. - 30 Blue Coat Cofe Academy (although it is in Coventry East Deanery, it is linked with Holy Trinity Church in Coventry City Centre, in Coventry North Deanery) We thank God for a wonderful start to the term, especially as we've welcomed hundreds of new pupils into Year 7. Luke Williams says, "I also begun my journey as the new School Chaplain, and I'd be so grateful for your prayers-that I would carry the light, love, and truth of Jesus into every corner of our school. In our Collective Worship, we're exploring the powerful 'I AM' statements of Jesus. Please pray that both staff and pupils would be amazed by who Jesus is and how He reveals Himself to us."

other as we are made in the image of God.




Sunday 12th October Scripture: Amos 5:24 Focus: Let justice roll



from 'What if Jesus was Serious About Prayer' Skye Jethani (Moody, 2021) "Prayer trains us to see God where we might otherwise miss Him. Without it, in our busy, information-overloaded culture, it is very easy to focus on everything other than God. We can be so focused on the news, our work, or the 10,000 things vying for our attention that we may go days and even weeks without seeing God in our lives. Of course, that doesn't mean He isn't there Prayer is a time to slow down, refocus, and notice God's presence." He says "There are certain forms of prayer that can train us to recognize God in the ordinary routines of our day." For example ... reflect on the events, encounters, and feelings that filled your day. You can replay the previous hours and ask yourself questions to uncover the hidden movements of God that might otherwise have gone unnoticed. This practice can often be done at the end of the day, although it could be done at the start of the day, "in anticipation of the events ahead."

Read Genesis 28.10-16

Surely the Lord is in this place, and I was not aware of it.

Jacob left Beersheba and set out for Harran. When he reached a certain place, he stopped for the night because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones there, he put it under his head and lay down to sleep. He had a dream in which he saw a stairway resting on the earth, with its top reaching to heaven, and the angels of God were ascending and descending on it. There above it stood the LORD, and he said: "I am the LORD, the God of your father Abraham and the God of Isaac. I will give you and your descendants the land on which you are lying. Your descendants will be like the dust of the earth, and you will spread out to the west and to the east, to the north and to the south. All peoples on earth will be blessed through you and your offspring. I am with you and will watch over you wherever you go, and I will bring you back to this land. I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you." When Jacob awoke from his sleep, he thought, "Surely the LORD is in this place, and I was not aware of it"
