Loving One Another (including Ethnic Diversity, Race Equality, Difference, Living in Love & Faith, Reconcilation and Conflict)

Being a reconciling presence in the heart of our communities

When we see divisions around us in the world and close to home, the Difference course is equipping communities and individuals to build community cohesion, navigate disagreement, and cross divides through our everyday encounters. Our Race Equality Steering Group has developed a strategy to improve race equality within the diocese. This is done through consultation with the Race Equality Advisory Group (REAG) and churches. The Living in Love and Faith (LLF) project has produced resources to help the whole Church to learn how relationships, marriage and sexuality fit within the bigger picture of a humanity created in the image of God, and to understand each other better. At an international level, our cathedral continues to promote reconciliation through the Community of the Cross of Nails.

This month it will have been a year since the events in Palestine and Israel. How can we pray with love and dignity?

Archbishop Hosam Naoum of Jerusalem has offered the following prayer,

O God of all justice and peace, we cry out to you in the midst of the pain and trauma of violence and fear which prevails in the Holy Land. Be with those who need you in these days of suffering; we pray for people of all faiths - Jews, Muslims and Christians and for all people of the land. While we pray to you, O Lord, for an end to violence and the establishment of peace, we also call to you to bring justice and equity to the peoples. Guide us into your kingdom where all people are treated with dignity and honour as your children - for to all of us you are our Heavenly Father. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

If you'd like explore the role Christian have as agents of reconciliation, consider this <u>learning event</u> hosted by Embrace the Middle East.

Reconciliation is at the very heart of our calling as a diocese. We are to share the story of Coventry Cathedral's response to the bombing in 1940 afresh for every generation. Canon Mary Gregory asks, "please would you pray with us for:

- the launch, in January, of the Reconciliation Pathway; for those with an interest or calling in reconciliation to come and explore more of what this might mean for them;
- the encouragement of diocesan partners in the Community of the Cross of Nails (the Cathedral's international reconciliation network), that they might rediscover their calling as a CCN partner;
- the Cathedral's focus on new strands of reconciliation: what reconciliation to the earth might look like, and what a reconciler's response to the rise of the far right might be."

Having respectful & authentic conversations - Living in Love & Faith (LLF)

Emma de Crick Boom, Reconciliation Enabler, writes, "It is possible that you may engage with people who feel differently to you or others who have a very different life experience to you. As you acquaint yourself with the prayers of love and faith which are intended for members of the LGBTQI community, think and pray for the same sex couples who may enquire after them and consider how vulnerable this may feel as they make that step. Whatever relationships you are engaging with, I'd like to offer you a question that I both ask myself, and others with pastoral responsibility and therefore would like to ask you.

What is your intent? Or What is your posture?

How do you hold yourself in those pastoral spaces? What is the internal processing going on that checks in on how your feeling and how you may respond to another. It is about how you prepare yourself, spiritually, physically and emotionally.

There are aspects of relational dynamics that you can plan for in an encounter, by anticipating temperaments and familiar reactions. Other people's responses are not usually, if ever, within our control. It can often be the case that our own responses may catch us unawares, even feel a bit out of our control. - Can you imagine a situation like that?

So, the aim is not to change feelings or convictions, but pro-actively raise our own level of intent as we enter different relational spheres.

Jesus said, blessed are the peace makers for they will be called children of God, (Matthew 5:9). As we acknowledge the capacity for great love within ourselves and those around us, so we might also be able to acknowledge the capacity for hostility within ourselves and those around us. It makes this call to lean into our identity in Christ as peace makers only more poignant. If we want to have healthy conversations with PCCs and different Church members having conversations about PLF; then it is key to examine ourselves, noticing how positions and sentiments in these encounters can have an effect. Recognizing how it may impact and influence on how we relate to one another. Let us pray for God's great love to be increased within us, to show itself through us in authentic and practical ways."
