The final extracts, this month, from Mark Oakley's 'The Collage of God'

 Chapter 7, 'Laughing' and 'Postscript' (pp. 86-103) and 'God Soaked
 Life' – Epilogue and Taking Part by Chris Webb (pp 179-184).

first from Mark Oakley

'Laughter is a very large piece of my collage of faith. I can think of no better way of spending time than laughing with family or friends And of watching comic genius at work on the stage or screen.... To write this book and not mention laughter would be as negligent as failing to mention God.' (p.87ff). He goes on, 'It has been said that too many clergy take as their motto in life: 'Start each day with a smile – get it over with.'' (p. 90) – he quotes a past Canon of St Paul's cathedral, who said 'when wit is combined with sense and information, when it is softened by benevolence and restrained by principle, when it is in the hands of one who loves humour, justice, decency, good nature, morality and religion, wit is then a beautiful part of nature.' (p. 90) St Francis described his monastic order as jokers and jesters of God. At times, when God laughs in the Bible, it is usually at people rather than with them...humour can comfort and disturb (p. 93). He concludes, 'to be able to laugh brings change and possibility into your life as you view yourself, your limitations and foibles, your absurdities and enjoyments, in a strong light. It is, for me, a holy act.' (p. 97)



In the postscript he quotes
Nennius, 'I have made a heap of
all that I could find'.... 'The pieces
of the collage I have introduced
here are mere scraps of fabric of
a much greater creation. They are
important fragments that begin
to outline a soul's shaping and
architecture...' (pp. 98, 99) 'I
have tried to argue that it is a
confidently poetic, truthful,
laughing, serving, prayerful
Church that will be able to share
conversations with such a world

about a hidden God who reveals to us all we need to discover.' (p. 102)

and from Chris Webb

'So close to the end, you're finally able to see clearly what really mattered. Perhaps not, as it turns out, your wealth, your reputation, your sense of achievement, your possessions, your career — all those things you were so attentive to over the years. Instead, you see that it was always about people and relationships. About love, kindness, gentleness, grace, compassion,

friendship... And your friendship with God, you realise, always meant so much too. From the beginning, God had been creating a community of loving people in which he would dwell.' (p. 180) Having posed the questions as if it was the end of our life, he then switches suddenly 'Now imagine one more thing. Imagine this is not the day before you die. Instead, it is simply *today*. Another ordinary day in this extraordinary life. Imagine that you still have time: time to explore, to learn, to grow, to change, to live. What might it look like for you today – this wild, beautiful, magnificent God-soaked life?' (p. 181)

So, 'how do we live a God-soaked life?'

- 1. We accept Jesus' invitation to participate in God's community of love.
- 2. We are seeking renewal of our hearts so we can love as Christ loves.
- 3. We are fearlessly honest about our weaknesses, failures and limits.
- 4. We long to experience God in silence, prayer and Scripture.
- 5. We nurture awareness of God in everyday life.
- 6. We share life together with love, grace, mercy, and reconciliation.
- 7. We share the hope and courage to challenge the "lordless powers."

'We follow Jesus, as best we can, we follow Jesus. That's enough.' (p. 183)
