The diocese is home to around **895 thousand people** across Coventry and Warwickshire

70% of the population live across four urban areas of Coventry, Leamington, Nuneaton and Rugby


Two thirds of our parishes are categorized as rural or semi rural

2 major universities and 60,000 term time students

Approximately 39% of the population in Coventry is GMH / UKME compared to 19% in Warwickshire

57 Parishes recording growth


8 Recording growth of more than 40 people
