- Summary of significant features (e.g. font, windows, reredos, monuments, bells, organ, plate, war memorials etc)
- Materials (sandstone, lead roof etc)
- Description of location and setting (including churchyard)
- Description of historic and current use
- Significant events and/or personalities

2. The significance of the church and contents

- Particular architectural features
- Items or objects of interest
- A feature of county/national etc life?

Assessing Significance...

- **High**: important at national to international level
- Moderate-High: important at regional level
- Moderate: Usually of local value but of regional significance for its group (or other) value
- Low-Moderate: of local value
- Low: adds little or nothing to the value of the site or detracts from it.

3. Assessment of the impact of the proposals on the significance

This should be separate section giving detailed information on features or items that will be affected by the proposed changes.

- Include photos
- If you have specialist reports, reference them too

What else should I include?

- Plan of church
- Map of local area with churchyard boundary on it
- At least two photos (internal & external)
- Other photos where necessary

- Review it annually (and update when necessary)
- Store it electronically
- Make it interesting and readable
- Not too long
- Share it
- Ask me to read through it ©









St Jerome's Church, Godric's Hollow

- Grade I listed and in a Conservation Area
- Earliest parts date to 961 AD
- Side aisles and tower added in 14th & 15thC
- Pews date to 14th & 15thC
- 15th internal porch door (with musket ball holes in it)









Options Appraisal

- Put a curtain in entrance doorway
- Install a 'draught lobby' inside entrance
- Install a 'draught lobby' in porch
- Put glazed doors on porch entrance
