The Diocese of Coventry have invited Dr Rachel Jordan-Wolf [Executive Director of HOPE together & Former National Mission and Evangelism Adviser to the Church of England.] to present and unpack the findings from this latest research and to highlight any significant changes since the original Talking Jesus research that was carried out in 2015.
